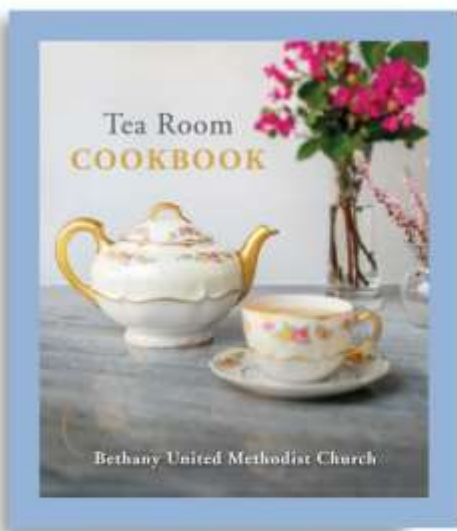

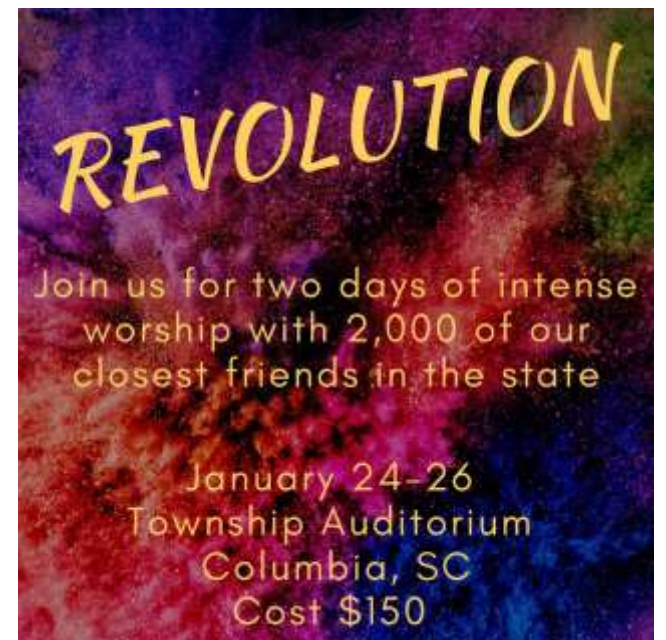

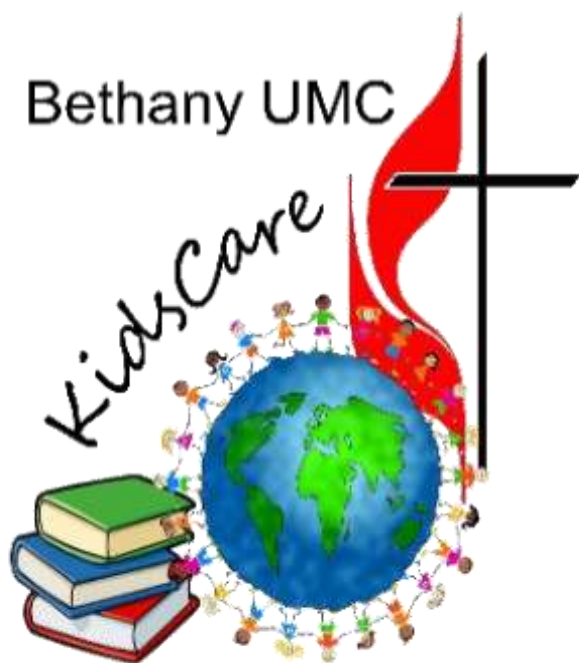

Bethany's Child Development Center provides quality early childhood programs in a loving, nurturing, Christian environment for Toddlers through Kindergarten.
