I was going to be able to walk into the church and wave the branch high above my head and place it at the altar rail. What a feeling it was to perform the mighty task. However, did I really know what I was doing; Probably not.

As I sit and watch the children coming forward on Palm Sunday now, I smile as I reminisce about years past. How wonderful and innocent they look waving the palms with the big smiles on their faces. How innocent I once was also. Why did I grow up and learn more about the day of Palm Sunday and Holy Week? Why did I have to find out that it was actually someone like me who turned his back on Jesus?

Holy Week is filled with contrasts. On Palm Sunday we experience the joyous demonstration of the one who comes in the name of the Lord as we shout "Hosanna, Hosanna" and wave our palms in acclamation. The hopeful wave palms, symbolizing the triumph in Jesus Christ; the one who comes in the name of the Lord to set us free from our destructive longings. These palms become pledges of resurrection. As our journey of Lent draws us closer to the cross,, we cling to these palms as we proclaim Christ's suffering on earth. As Jesus descended from the Mount of Olives and through the cheers from the crowd, He certainly knew that the people would turn against Him. Jesus coming down the mountain and entering the city wore a painful smile.

If we want to cheer for Jesus, then we need to walk with Jesus beyond the day of Palm/Passion Sunday. We need to stand with Jesus as He is witnessing in the temple on Monday. We need to walk with Jesus on Tuesday. We need to listen to Jesus on Wednesday. We need to dine with and pray with Jesus on Thursday. We need to take up our cross and walk faithfully with Jesus on Friday. We will wait all day Saturday because of the unknown and the sadness of the death of our Lord. Then and only then on Sunday, we indeed can shout "Hosanna" for the God who delivered us from death to life, from sorrow to joy, from the grave to grace. May your Holy Week be filled with praise as you keep your eyes fixed on Jesus, and the road he traveled.


The Last Supper



Bethany friends, this article introduces you to Miss Natasha Muwani who is the recipient of a Bethany funded scholarship to attend Africa University.

Natasha is a 21-year-old native of Zimbabwe. She is the daughter of a single mom and an excellent student. She received a full scholarship (tuition, room and board) to one of Zimbabwe's top ten high schools. She had to wait a year following high school to have sufficient funds to enter Africa University and achieved a GPA of 3.83 in her first year. That qualified her for a scholarship at AU and the University recommended her to us following our notifying the university we would like to provide a scholarship for a needy student. Natasha is an international relations major and aspires to be an ambassador. Last year she played on the Zimbabwe national ladies field hockey U21 (under 21) team. She plans to continue playing hockey at a high level.



Africa University was formed and built by the United Methodist Church 30 years ago. It is an example of how a connectional church like the UMC can tackle large projects. Enrollment is currently about 2,800. The student population currently comes from 23 different countries in Africa, graduation rate is 94.7% and 92% of the graduates serve in Africa. Despite it's relatively small size, AU is currently ranked the 4th best university in Zimbabwe. Graduates are often very successful. AU is located in Mutare, Zimbabwe on land that was part of the Old Mutare Mission. The Old Mutare Mission was started by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1898. Today the Old Mutare Mission has a hospital, orphanage and a school. Methodism has been active in mission in what is now Zimbabwe for a long time.

Her letter to us following her learning of the scholarship follows:

February 2023

This letter serves to express my heartfelt gratitude for the sponsorship, I would not have imagined how the semester would have started and went by. When was notified about the news, I was ecstatic and I could not wait for this moment to write to explain how appreciative I am. Currently I am doing my second year studies in Bachelor of Science Honors in International Relations and I would say I am in the field I belong in. I plan to obtain my first degree in June 2026 and I aspire to work in the field of politics as an Ambassador and being a national hockey player I plan to get recognized internationally. I have received so much support and I would like to give back to the community as I study and once I graduate. Again I thank you for the huge contribution towards my studies, it is in my duty to keep up with my grades and keep my word. I look forward to having you as part of this journey

Gift cards will be used to purchase shoes, hoodies, jackets and underwear.



Famous Author James M. Scott Speaker at April Happy Hearts

The April 28, 2023. Happy Hearts luncheon speaker is famous author James M. Scott. A former Nieman Fellow at Harvard, James M. Scott is the author most recently of *Black Snow: Curtis LeMay, the Firebombing of Tokyo, and the Road to the Atomic Bomb*. His previous works include *Rampage*, which was named one of the Best Books of 2018 by the editors at Amazon, *Kirkus*, and *Military Times* and was chosen as a finalist for the prestigious Gilder Lehrman Prize for Military History by the New York Historical Society. Other works include *Target Tokyo*, a 2016 Pulitzer Prize finalist, *The War Below* and *The Attack on the Liberty*, which won the Rear Admiral Samuel Eliot Morison Award. In addition to writing, Scott is a sought-after public speaker on World War II. Over the years, he has lectured on military bases, at presidential libraries, book festivals, and in universities and museums around the world. Scott lives with his wife and two children in Mt. Pleasant, SC.

His book, *Black Snow: Curtis LeMay, the Firebombing of Tokyo, and the Road to the Atomic Bomb,* will be the focus of Mr. Scott's discussion at the Happy Hearts luncheon.

All in all, as I said above, what an exciting time in the Music Ministry! I am so blessed to be a humble part of it.


