#### PKs, Light bulbs, and Believing - Devotional Bethany 2023

The disciple Thomas did not believe the other disciples when they said that Jesus had appeared to them. Thomas said that he had to see the nail prints in the hands and a hole in the side of Jesus to believe in the Resurrection. What kind of faith is that? Everyone knows the old saying, "seeing is believing". So Jesus did appear to Thomas and said these words, "Do you believe because you see me? Blessed are those who believe without seeing me."

There was a dirty PK (preacher's kid) who was called by his mother to dinner one night. The mother told him that he should wash his hands because there were germs living in all that dirt. He refused and complained: "Germs and Jesus! Germs and Jesus! That's all I ever hear around this house, and I've never seen either one." Why is it so hard to have faith in that we cannot see?

"What the mind of people can conceive and believe, it can achieve," wrote Napoleon Hill. Let me put it another way. How much will you accomplish by convincing yourself that it cannot be done? Defeatism never accomplished anything lasting or worthwhile, but optimism born of faith has accomplished tremendous feats. Surprising as it is to some, creativity born of faith has its roots in the Bible. "As he thinks within himself, so he is" (Prov. 23:7); "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:13); "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men" (Col. 3:23).

Scores of people have been challenged with concepts or goals others have said were impossible or unattainable. With God's help they reached them. Thomas Edison attempted more than 10,000 experiments to create the light bulb and they all failed. "Edison quit," said his co-workers "It just cannot be done." Instead, Edison said, "I have found 10,000 ways it cannot be done; now I will find one way it can be done." What others considered impossible became his goal, which he eventually accomplished.

The difference between the gospel of Jesus Christ and the force of human motivation is the upward dimension – through Christ. There is a limit to what you can do in the natural, but there is absolutely no limit to what can be accomplished in faith through God's power.

Don't listen to the voice of pessimism that says, "You are trapped – you cannot do it. You might as well quit for it cannot be done." Quietly resolve in your heart, "With God's help, I'll do it," and you will discover what the mind of man can conceive and believe.

Our guest speaker for the May Happy Hearts meeting is Racena Bowen from Middleton Place Plantation. Located along the Ashley River in Charleston, Middleton Place is a rare survivor of the American Revolution, Civil War, economic upheavals, and natural disasters. First granted in 1675, this National Historic Landmark connects to the very fabric of our nation's complex history focusing on the contributions of the Middleton family as well as the enslaved Africans and African Americans who lived and worked here. The stories are a microcosm of United States history. Middleton Place is a National Historic Landmark, home to the oldest land-scaped gardens in America and an enduring, vibrant, and essential part of the Charleston and American experience.






