The lesson comes with a short video to go along with the story of the day. We have a rotating group of volunteers to help with this ministry, so it is not an every week commitment.

Wednesday nights are an amazing way to get involved in Children's Ministries. Two people are needed to assist in our preschool Cherub Choir practice from 6:00 – 6:45pm. This position helps the choir director with bathroom breaks and sign-in/out time. We also need a few helpers in the Preschool Sprouts Bible Story class from 6:45- 7:30. All lessons and supplies are provided for you. This is a simple way to help – it is just reading a bible story, doing a very quick activity and giving the preschoolers time to play and unwind while waiting for Mom and Dad to finish their class. This can be every Wednesday, or we can have a rotating group.

Helpers are also needed in the Elementary Choirs. This position helps Mrs. Barbara with bathroom breaks, moving kids from location to location and with general crowd control. Mrs. Sharon needs another set of hands in Crafting Faith helping with all of the amazing projects they do. Either of these positions can be either 6-6:45 or 6:45-7:30 or both!

We are starting a new class, Bible Adventures, as an alternative to choir practice. Leaders are needed to help kids learn Bible skills, play games to reinforce learning and teach about worship. All lessons and supplies are provided

Our Fall Volleyball league will begin in early September and will again feature two divisions:


- Juniors 7th Graders and Below
