During this Stephen Ministry Emphasis Month, we are pleased to introduce our newest Stephen Leader, Michelle Helton!

She completed the first training course in 2017. After successfully serving several Care Receivers, she agreed to take the Leader Course in early 2023. Michelle will be commissioned as a Stephen Leader in the September 10 Word & Table Service. She shares her story below.



Michelle Helton - Registered Nurse, traveler, mom to two awesome kids and their fabulous spouses; now ' living my best life as Gramma Chelle to my first grand baby.'

" Many years ago Linda Carter asked me if would be interested in becoming a Stephen Minister. So, she planted the seed!

I had first heard of Stephen Ministry through a program with the chaplain's department when I was an ICU nurse at Trident Medical Center. I did not realize then that this is a world-wide program

extending across denominations. Also I didn't understand that it could be experienced on such a personal level, "being there" for someone in a time of crisis. While I initially declined recruitment due to scheduling constraints at that point in my life, I knew it was something calling me. I was experienced with and comfortable in supporting people in the middle of trying times in my nursing career. Also I am a caregiver and compassionate by nature, a good listener, a strong communicator, and filled with faith. I knew how my faith had seen me through tough times, and how important my supports were to me. Years after that seed was planted, I went through the 2017 training class and then Stephen Leader training this year. It is an honor to be matched with someone who is hurting and be a part of their journey to healing."

A new Stephen Minister Training class will start in January, 2024.


Children's Church
