Psalm 23 says God is like a shepherd. A shepherd loves and cares for his sheep. He watches them closely, protects them from danger, and makes sure they have enough to eat and drink. To say God is our shepherd means that God watches over us and will show us what is best for us. The key thing for us sheep to do is listen to what the good shepherd has to say. Jesus said about his followers, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me." (John 10:27) Listening to God is something we should be doing all the time.

It is helpful if we are comfortable while we prepare to listen to the Lord. If our bodies are too tense, or we are too cool, or too hot, or our back aches because the chair is uncomfortable, our minds will keep coming back to our physical discomforts, instead of relaxing and thinking of the Lord. It can be a great blessing to sit quietly in God's presence, not thinking about anything in particular, not wanting anything from God, but just to enjoy God's company. That was the testimony of a lady who told how she would often wake up in the middle of the night and spend an hour or so with God. I felt that my own increasing awareness of the Lord was rather small and insignificant beside her powerful testimony.

Some people find that God speaks to them while they are on the move. Another friend shared that she heard the Lord many times while taking her dog for a walk. For myself, I hear God while walking on the beach with the waves roaring in the background. From scripture we have the story of the two disciples walking on the Emmaus road, who said afterwards: "Did not our hearts burn within us while God talked to us on the road?" (Luke 24:32) God is not limited by any conditions that we lay down; so we need to widen our thinking and expect God to speak to us at any time, in any place. We are the sheep, are we listening to the Good Shepherd? - Reverand Michael Ritter
