
Child Development Center

Happy Hearts

January 26th, Reservations for Lunch Due by January 21st <u>Guest Speaker - Joseph F. Tallon</u>

Our speaker this month is Lieutenant Colonel Joe Tallon (Retired) who served over 37 years in the US Army from 1969 to 2007. Joe has written the book, *100 Days in Vietnam: A Memoir of Love, War and Survival* that tells of the day-to-day life of a first lieutenant in combat.

Joe is a native Charlestonian who graduated in 1969 in the first graduating class at the Baptist College at Charleston. By the end of the summer of 1969, he had been drafted into the U.S. Army. After his tour in Vietnam and his recovery, Joe earned a Master's Degree in Education in Secondary Education & Supervision from The Citadel. Joe's primary duty in Vietnam was to fly an OV-1D Mohawk. The Mohawk is a plane that uses infrared and SLAR (Side Looking Airborne Radar). His purpose was to detect troop movements and convoys.

Joe's love for his wife Martha Anne is shown in the book since he wrote love letters to her almost every day he was in Vietnam. These letters became the foundation of the book and provided an accurate account of exactly what happened each day. The book also deals with Joe's recovery from multiple wounds and the quest to get his Purple Heart and the one for his observer, Daniel Richards. It took 36 years to get Joe's medals and another 5 years to get Daniel's medals. Joe considers this his final mission for the US Army. This book was written by Joe and his older son Matthew. It has won numerous national awards including a Silver Medal for Memoirs from the Military Writers Society of America and an International Book Award 2021 Finalist for Military History.
